# Motherly ape has its own baby

BROOKFIELD, ILL. A Brookfield Zoo gorilla which showed off her maternal instincts when she cradled a toddler who fell into the exhibit has become a mother, again. Binti Jua, a western lowland gorilla, gave birth this week. Binti, 17, was moved from the San Francisco Zoo to Brookfield in 1991 for breeding. The ape gave birth to her only other baby in 1995. In 1996, Binti picked up a 3year-old boy who fell into the gorilla exhibit and carried him to a doorway where zoo staff could reach him.
