

### Signal Extends Distribution in This Territory

Appointment of M. F. Roach as distributor in this territory was officially announced today by the Signal Oil & Gas Company. Roach has a score of re-sellers to cooperate with.

In February, 1932 the company entered into an agreement with the Standard Oil Company of California for an exchange of natural gasoline and crude oil for motor gasoline and other petroleum products. The company, which markets its products on a strictly full price basis, continues to be independent in ownership and operations.

Gasoline sales for 1932 were approximately 29,000,000 gallons, the major portion of which were sold through controlled outlets, as compared with 24,000,000 gallons for 1931, of which very little was sold through controlled outlets. At the present rate of increase, 1933 sales should be considerably in excess of those in 1932.

An important expansion development in connection with Northwest marketing operations took place during March when Signal Oil & Gas Company purchased the marketing facilities of the Hancock Oil Company in Washington and the Liberty Petroleum Corporation, operating in both Oregon and Washington.

With Roach as the main distributor and a score of energetic re-sellers, the Signal organization now has a "live" group of agencies in this field.

### MacDONALD LAUDS U. S. PRESIDENT

LONDON—Prime Minister MacDonald, returning home with his daughter Ishbel Wednesday said:

"America is hard hit and suffering terribly from the depression, but in those unhappy economic circumstances I found in Washington the most worthwhile of all constructive things—a spirit of co-operation so marked it cannot fail to have results.

"I am pleased with the whole of our transactions. I met a man who is sincerely interested in getting things on the move in the world and we found ourselves in most complete agreement as to objects. Generally speaking, our conversations were successful.

"In President Roosevelt I found a man after my own heart. The results may be judged by the future, but at the moment enough has already been done to justify the visit. I am satisfied that we have established more firmly the bonds of Anglo-American friendship."

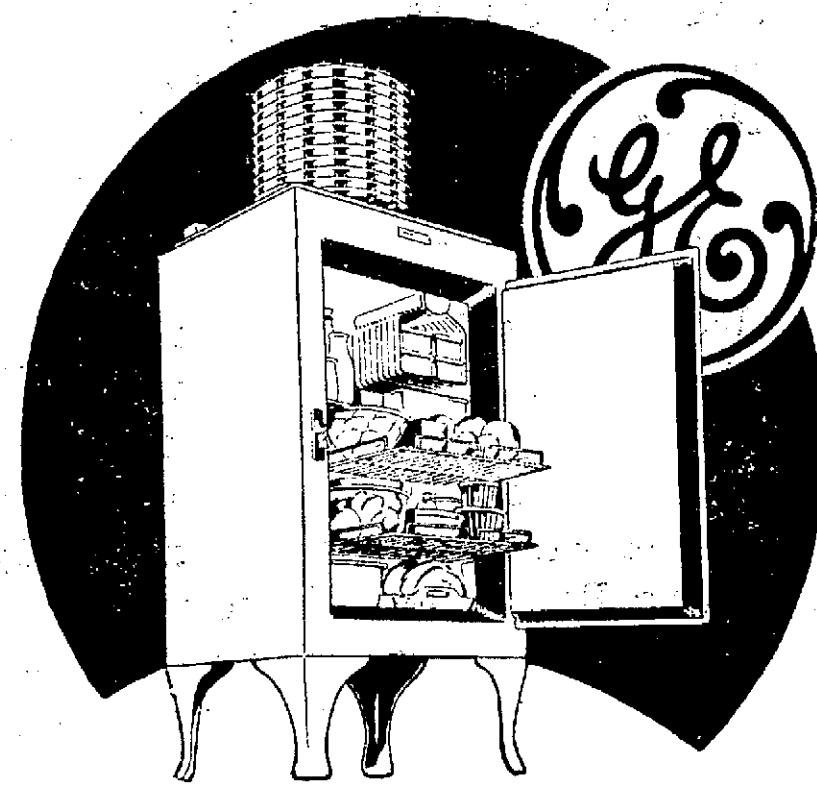

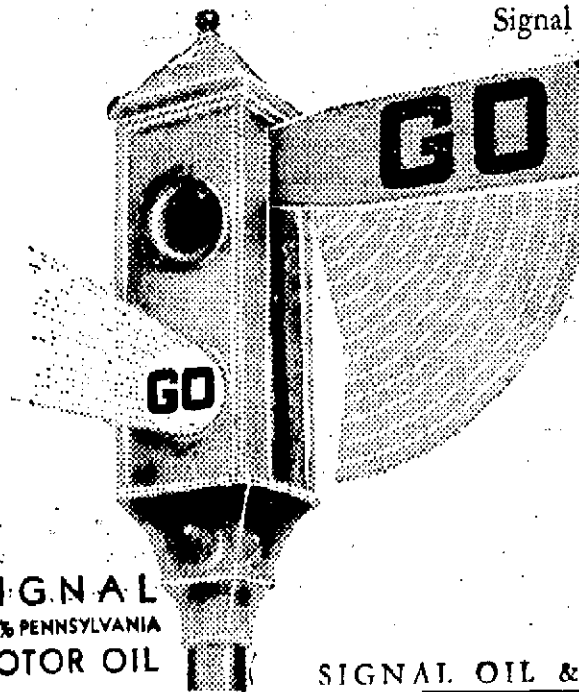
